



In November 1883, an enthusiastic group of amateurs put on a production of Gilbert and Sullivan's 'The Pirates of Penzance'. The result was a spectacular success, which lived long in the memories of Oamaru locals. The cast members were a multitalented bunch, who contributed to many aspects of the Oamaru community.

For one man, appearing in the show was a life-changing experience. But along with the plaudits, darker forces were unleashed: deception, adultery and death in the Klondike.




